Criteria to Determine the Worthiness of Buildings or Sites for Historic Landmark Designation

The following criteria is to be used by the Village of Spring Lake Historic Conservation District Commission when evaluating the historic or architectural value of buildings or sites to be designated local historic landmarks:

1. Its character, interest, or value as a part of the development, heritage, or cultural characteristics of the community.
2. Its location as a site of a significant historical event.
3. Its identification with a person or persons who significantly contributed to the development of the community.
4. Its embodiment of distinguishing characteristics of an architectural style valuable for the study of a period, type, method of construction, or use of indigenous materials.
5. Its identification as the work of a master builder, designer, architect, or landscape architect whose individual work has influenced the development of the community.
6. Its embodiment of elements of design, detailing, materials, or craftsmanship that render it architecturally significant.
7. Its embodiment of design elements that make it structurally or architecturally innovative.
8. Its unique location or singular physical characteristics that make it an established or familiar visual feature.
9. Its suitability for preservation or restoration.
